Also, each parish, church, or ministry within the Communion fully recognizes

the catholicity and apostolicity of the other. One parish, church, or ministry is not above the other, or judges of the other, neither should it remain insensitive to the needs of the other.

A Heritage United

The United Ecumenical Communion of Christ looks, (in-part) towards *Anglicanism* as an historic example of the Ancient/Future episcopal model of the Church. NOT everyone in our Communion is of an Anglican background. We are a Communion made of various Christian parishes, churches, and ministries. Our Communion subscribes to the core beliefs of *Anglicanism and the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion*, yet we are an independent Communion and free in our ability to view and practice as we see fit. Our Communion is in-

clusive and not exclusive. We are a Communion of Christian ecumenical practice, belief, and worship. This means that each parish, church, or ministry within our Communion maintains its own independence and autonomy, but we operate as one body. Also, each parish, church, or ministry within the Communion fully recognizes the catholicity and apostolicity of the other. One parish, church, or ministry is not above the other, or judges the other, neither should it remain insensitive to the needs of the other.

Our adherence to the principles of Anglicanism and the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion in the United Ecumenical Communion of Christ is not shaped by its connection to the See of Canterbury, but by its relationship to history.

A family woman who resides in Florida, she is a mother of two adult children and grandmother of one.

Originally from Jamaica but now a citizen of the United States, Dr. Baylor travels globally to teach and preach the gospel, deliver those who are oppressed, and educate others about God's powerful word. Her impact reaches individuals from all walks of life, with a focus on promoting wholeness in mind, soul, and body. She

began her ministry at just 9 years old under the guidance of the 12th Street Church of God in Kingston, Jamaica. By age 12, she was conducting street meetings throughout the island.

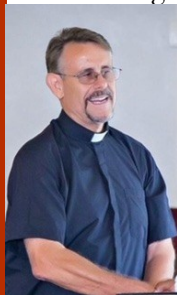
Bishop Harrison S. Knight

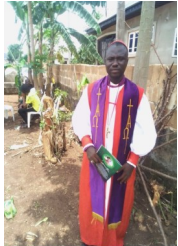

St. Katherine Jean Medical Clinic



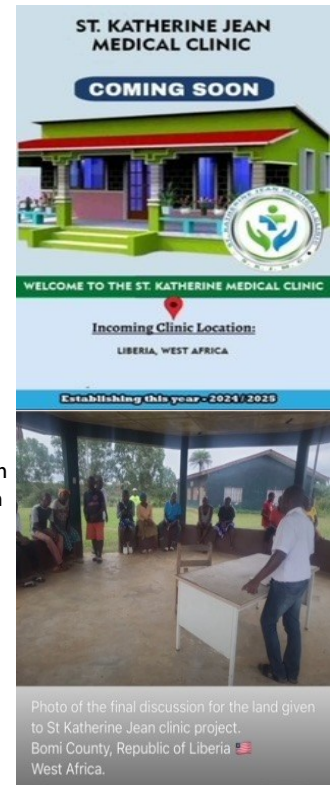

St Katherine Jean Medical Clinic will be named in honor of Katherine Jean Thompson, born Nov 11, 1948 to Carolyn and Gerald Adams of Marshall Michigan. She was the oldest of two sisters, and lived the majority of her life in Northeast Virginia. Katherine Jean as a child, loved history and everything about. Katherine Jean Thompson was married to Ronald Ives Thompson, a Draftsman in the United States Navy, who later went on to retire from the U.S Navy in Norfolk, VA. Katherine Jean and Ronald had four children; Raymond, Teresa, Gerald, and John Thompson. Early in their marriage, Katherine Jean would become a stay at home mom who was very devoted to the church and her family. Katherine Jean had an extreme love for history, and would later go on to retire after 31 yrs, as an acclaimed historian of Colonial Williamsburg in Virginia. Katherine Jean loved people and never met a person without giving them a hug and sharing her love for history with them. In 2013 Katherine Jean Thompson would pass away from cancer, leaving a hole in the church, her family and the community she served.
